TRINE PERTOU MACH



Trine is deeply engaged in sustainability and the human perspective as core to everything we do – from buildings, over livable cities, to Nordic and global policies.

BERT TEUNISSEN

Tor (b. 1955) is an independent author, thinker and lecturer based in Copenhagen, Denmark. Among his 20+ books, the best known is "The User Illusion" about consciousness, perception and information (1998).

His most recent book, co-authored with artist Olafur Eliasson, is "Light! The light in life and the life in light" (2015).

REIULF RAMSTAD



Reiulf is a Norwegian architect. In 1995, he graduated from the Venice School of Architecture and founded Reiulf Ramstad architect firm.

Reiulf has earned a reputation for creating bold, simple architecture with a strong connection to the Scandinavian context and the impressive Scandinavian landscape in particular. Common for all his projects are that they are driven by a genuine dedication to humanist values.

FEDERICO FAVARO



Federico is a lecturer and program coordinator for the master in Architectural Lighting Design at KTH Royal Institute of Technology in Stockholm.

The education attracts students from all over the world with its humanistic approach to daylight as fundamental to architecture and essential for human well-being.

CARSTEN THAU



Carsten, with a background in history of ideas, is a professor in Theory and History of Architecture at KADK. He has formerly worked at University of Copenhagen as an Associate Professor in Modern Culture and written extensively about Danish 20th Century Architecture besides arts, philosophical aesthetics and film. Among other publications should be mentioned Architecture as a Time Machine from 2011. Thau is a frequent lecturer at academies abroad and has a broad public audience in Denmark.
